- 1. to God. (2 Chronicles 20:3)
- Often, when situations arise in our lives, we talk to everyone • but God. (Proverbs 3:5-6)
- 2. Focus on God through ______. (2 Chronicles 20:3)
- What we find consistently throughout Scripture is when • people humble themselves through the discipline of fasting and set their heart to seek God; He speaks, He acts, and He works on behalf of those who seek Him.

3. Pray God's . (2 Chronicles 20:7–9)

- When you find yourself in an overwhelming situation, or a situation of opportunity, pray God's Word. Declare what God has already revealed.
- 4. Don't be ______. (2 Chronicles 20:15, 20)
- When we focus on the problem fear grows, but when we focus on God faith grows.
- Fear will paralyze you and limit your life, but faith will position you and propel you to experience God's provision.
- 5. Move in . (2 Chronicles 20:21–22)
- As the Israelites went out worshipping—declaring the greatness of God—God fought for them.

After a great victory, King Jehoshaphat named the valley the Valley of Beracah, which means Valley of Blessing. God had turned their time of trouble to a time of victory, and their time of opportunity to a time of blessing.
