- 1. _____ (Habakkuk 2:1)
- Sometimes when we are not getting answers to our questions it's because we're not willing to pause and wait long enough for God to reveal Himself.
- Psalm 46:10—"Be still, and know that I am God."
- 2. _____ (Habakkuk 2:2)
- When God says something to you, record it, because your spiritual enemy is an expert at stealing the seeds of truth God wants to plant.

- 3. _____ (Habakkuk 2:3)
- When God has promised something, it will come to pass. But it will be His timing, not ours.
- Isaiah 40:31—"But those who wait on the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not be faint." NKJV
- 4. _____ (Habakkuk 2:4)
- "Faith is deliberate confidence in the character of God whose ways you may not understand at the time." Oswald Chambers
