## He Will Be Called: Part 2

Jesus was more than a baby born in Bethlehem; He was the Son of God in flesh and blood. Jesus is \_\_\_\_\_ who became like us so He could save us. (John 1:14)

What we celebrate at Christmas is more than an event, it is God coming into our world to make His presence, power and provision available to us. We have a Mighty God with us.

### As our Mighty God...

1. Jesus takes care of the demands \_\_\_\_\_ you.

  - “Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us.”—Ephesians 3:20

2. Jesus takes care of the demands \_\_\_\_\_ of you.
  - The power of Jesus is working for you to help with the demands of marriage, home, family, work, relationships, finances, and whatever you face in life.
  - “I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”—John 16:33
3. Jesus takes care of the demands of those \_\_\_\_\_ you.
  - The power of Jesus is at work through you as He empowers you by the Holy Spirit to \_\_\_\_\_ the needs of those around you.
  - “I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high.”—Luke 24:49

The good news for us today is that we have a power source available to us. We have Jesus, the Mighty God, working for our good.
