## Passover: God's Rescue Plan



From the crisis of the fall in the Garden of Eden, God set forth a plan of redemption that we might have our sins forgiven and be brought into a life-giving relationship with Him. Throughout the Old Testament, we see God unfolding His redemption plan.

### Exodus 12:1–14

#### For the Hebrew people, the Passover brought...

- \_\_\_\_\_ – The slaughtered lamb redeemed the people by becoming a substitute for the Israelite firstborn. The lamb died in their place.
- \_\_\_\_\_ – The application of the blood to the door post purified those within the house.
- \_\_\_\_\_ – The blood applied to the door post protected the people from the death angel.
- \_\_\_\_\_ – There was freedom from the slavery of the past and a release to a new future.

We celebrate the Passover today understanding that Jesus Christ was our Passover Lamb who gave his life for us. He died in our place that we might have abundant and eternal life. (*John 1:29, 1 Peter 1:18–19*)

### Jesus Christ – Our Rescue Plan

- Atonement – Christ redeemed us by becoming a \_\_\_\_\_ for us. He died in our place. (*2 Corinthians 5:22*)
- Purification – the \_\_\_\_\_ of Christ's blood purifies us. (*1 John 1:7, Ephesians 1:7*)
- Rescue – The blood of Christ \_\_\_\_\_ us from the power of sin and death. (*1 Corinthians 15:55–57*)
- Exodus – Our freedom in Christ \_\_\_\_\_ us to a new future. (*Ephesians 1:3–4*)

Every time we celebrate Holy Communion we are remembering and giving thanks for Christ our Passover Lamb who died that we might live.

Answers: Atonement; Purification; Rescue; Exodus; substitute; application; frees; releases
