 - Jesus is the Son of God who was the sacrificial lamb that gave His life to bring redemption for mankind.

 - *“Then I heard the angel in charge of the waters say: “You are just in these judgments, you who are and who were, the Holy One, because you have so judged.” —Revelation 16:5*
4. Jesus is the _____ of _____ as He returns with His church. (Chapters 19–20) *Revelation 19:11–16*
5. Jesus is the _____ as He takes His bride, the redeemed, to the heavenly city. (Chapters 21–22) *Revelation 21:9–10, 23*
 - In the end evil is defeated, there is a new heaven and new earth, and we will reign with Jesus forever.
